CENTRAL and UPPER Island Relief Care

Please Note:

Central Island Area and Campbell River area: Foster Caregivers are encouraged to contact their Resource Social Worker, or the Child's Social Worker when seeking relief care from Ministry approved caregivers.

As you are responsible for ensuring the suitability of any person entrusted with the care of the child in your home, usually you will use an approved foster caregiver. Ideally you would identify proposed relief care providers (e.g. relatives, family, friends) when your home study assessment is in process so that future relief care providers can be screened/assessed/approved at the same time.

Relief-a break from caregiving—is important for both the child-in-care and the foster caregivers in most family care homes. Relief means overnight care, typically lasting 1-3 days that takes place either in the foster caregiver's home or in the home of the relief care provider.

Respite is not the same as relief. Respite is out-of-home care provided or funded as a service to a child's parents with whom there is a Support Service Agreement. The child need not be in care.

Moose Hide Campaign Day Moose Hide Campaign Day Mav 15th

The Moose Hide Campaign began as a BC-born Indigenous-led grassroots movement to engage men and boys in ending violence towards women and children. It has since grown into a nationwide movement of Indigenous and non-Indigenous Canadians from local communities, First Nations, governments, schools, colleges/universities, police forces and many other organizations — all committed to taking action to end this violence.

The campaign is grounded in Indigenous ceremony and traditional ways of learning and healing. A cornerstone of the Moose Hide Campaign is the moose hide pin. Wearing the pin signifies your commitment to honour, respect, and protect the women and children in your life and speak out against gender-based and domestic violence. To date, over five million moose hide pins have been distributed free of charge to communities, schools, and workplaces across Canada.





Why does it matter?

Every child needs to have deep connections and to feel a sense of belonging to culture, community, family and place in order to thrive and develop a positive sense of self. Children and youth who are in government care, in particular, need to feel these connections as they have typically experienced trauma during their young lives. Without these connections, they may experience what Dr. Martin Brokenleg has referred to as "unbelonging". And as a consequence, they may experience pain, sadness, distress, risk and poorer life outcomes.
